TOWARDS COMPETITIVE STROKES AND COACHING



Your pathway to becoming a licensed Australian Swim Coach

To coach on pool deck in Australia, it's important that you hold your Australian Swim Coach Licence. To obtain your licence, you'll need to:

- 1. Complete a Swimming Australia-approved prerequisite course (such as our TCSC Course)
- 2. Complete the Development Coaching Course

The TCSC pre-requisite course is more than just a step into coaching - it's your chance to build a strong foundation for success.

With a focus on stroke technique, advanced learn-to-swim progression, and the fundamentals of coaching, the course prepares you for success on the pool deck.



Who is eligible?

Anyone aged 16 years or older can register for this course.

It's ideal for:

- **1. Swimming teachers** ready to deepen their technical expertise and extend into higher levels of learn to swim teaching.
- **2. Aspiring licensed swim coaches** who need the required certification to enrol in the Development Coaching Course and begin their coaching career in Australia.
- **3. Anyone! Parents, Students, Active or Former Athletes** If you have a keen interest in learning more about swimming technique and you are considering a career in the aquatic industry, this prerequisite course provides an excellent opportunity to learn.

Note: You do not need to hold an AUSTSWIM Teacher of Swimming and Water Safety qualification to enrol. Computer/internet access required only for participants undertaking the trainer-led online version.

NATIONAL DROWNING REPORT 2025

The National Drowning Report 2025 released last month by Royal Life and Surf Life Saving Australia revealed heartbreaking news:

THE FULL

REPORT

- 357 lives lost to drowning in the past year
- A 27% increase on the 10-year average
- The **highest number of drownings** since records began

Every statistic is a person, a family, a community impacted.



Royal Life Saving Australia, with the support of the National Aquatic Industry Committee and State and Territory Member organisations, has released the *National Aquatic Industry Workforce Report 2025*.

Key Findings

- The national aquatic industry employs approximately 85,000 people.
- Key roles include swimming and water safety teachers (33%), lifeguards (20%), and customer service staff (15%).
- Women now represent 54% of senior leadership positions.

Issues & Needs

- Almost 45% of the aquatics workforce is employed casually, and 34% work fewer than 15 hours per week.
- Although the share of those working 32+ hours has more than tripled since 2019, this increase highlights a growing demand for greater job stability and financial security.

Challenges

- Occupational violence and aggression (OVA) remains a major concern, with 90% of workers reporting exposure and 25% experiencing it frequently.
- Safety perceptions are troubling—44% feel unsafe to a concerning degree, and 18% report feeling unsafe at an alarming level.
- While leadership quality is viewed positively by 57%, 15% rate it as low, showing uneven perceptions across the workforce.

Opportunities

- Over half of workers (53%) believe the aquatic industry offers strong career prospects, and 51% express long-term ambitions to remain in the sector.
- Staff continue to cite purpose and community contribution as the most fulfilling aspects of their roles, reinforcing the potential to attract and retain talent through values-based engagement.
